

**CHAPTER 60
HEALTH-RELATED FEES**

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60-1. General Provisions. 1. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

a. "Calendar year" means January 1 to December 31.

b. "Department" means the health department or any department to which health department functions or duties have been delegated pursuant to a memorandum of understanding.

2. LICENSE PERIOD. A license or permit fee shall be paid for the entire license or permit period or for any fraction thereof except where otherwise provided. In the absence of provisions to the contrary, no license or permit fee shall be transferable or prorated.

3. REFUND OF FEES BY HEALTH DEPARTMENT. a. Except as otherwise provided, if an application for a license or permit issued by the health department is withdrawn, or if such a license or permit is denied or not issued, the following amounts shall be retained by the health department to defray the city's cost of processing the application pursuant to this chapter:

a-1. \$25 if the license or permit fee is less than \$100.

a-2. \$61, if the license or permit fee is more than \$100.

b. The refundable portion of the fee shall be refunded by the health department upon receipt of a written request by the applicant, provided such request is made no later than one year after the date of application for the license or permit. No refund shall be made after one year from the date of application.

60-2. Ambulance Certificate. 1. Each ambulance certificate shall be issued for the calendar year.

2. The fee for each original certificate shall be \$1,100.

3. The fee for each original certificate that is being renewed shall be \$1,100.

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4. If an initial application or application for renewal is denied, no fee paid shall be refunded.
(See s. 75-15.)

60-3. Animal Fancier Permit and Fees. 1. The fee for each animal fancier permit shall be \$50.

2. Each permit shall run for a period of one year from the date of issuance and shall be subject to annual renewal.

3. There shall be an additional \$20 late fee for any new or renewal permit application and fee that is received by the department later than the fifth day after the applicant has received the permit application.

4. A \$25 delayed inspection fee shall be charged whenever a permit holder fails to schedule and allow a department inspection of the premises as provided in s. 78-7-2-b-2.
(See s. 78-7.)

60-5. Animal Impoundment Fee. 1. The basic fee for the repossession of an impounded animal shall be \$50.

2. An additional fee shall be charged for each calendar day or fraction thereof for the costs of keeping the animal. (See s. 78-21.)

60-7. Animal Licenses. 1. The fee for an unspayed or unneutered cat or dog shall be \$24.

2. The fee for a spayed or neutered cat or dog shall be \$12.

3. Application for a license may be made from January 1 to April 1 without paying a late filing fee. Any license applied for after April 1 shall cost an additional \$12 for an unspayed or unneutered cat or dog, and \$6 for a spayed or neutered cat or dog, unless the applicant has proof that the animal has been acquired or that it has just reached the age of 5 months within the last 30 days prior to application or that the applicant has established city residency within the last 30 days prior to the application.

4. The fee for an unspayed or unneutered dog or cat which has not reached the age of 5 months prior to July 1 shall be \$12.

5. The fee for a spayed or neutered dog or cat which has not reached the age of 5 months prior to July 1 shall be \$6.

6. The fee for a replacement animal license shall be \$2.
(See s. 78-17.)

60-9. Asbestos Project Permit. The fee for each asbestos project shall be as follows:

1. Review and inspection of permit application: \$80.

2. Fees for a permit shall be computed as follows:

a. For a period not exceeding 3 days of asbestos project work: \$235.

b. For a period of 4 to 10 days of asbestos project work: \$390.

c. For a period exceeding 10 days of asbestos project work: \$540 or 1% of the total cost of the asbestos abatement project, whichever is greater. (See s. 66-12.)

60-13. Bed and Breakfast Establishment Permit. 1. A non-refundable pre-inspection fee of \$25 shall be charged at the time of application to anyone intending to operate a bed and breakfast establishment.

2. The annual fee for a bed and breakfast permit shall be \$61.

a. In addition, the applicant shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee, the amount of which is on file with the health department.

b. Each bed and breakfast permit shall be issued for the permit year beginning July 1 and ending on the following June 30.

c. Permit renewals shall be filed by July 1. There shall be an additional \$44 fee for the filing of a late renewal application. If renewal fee applications are not sent out by June 15, the late penalty will be assessed 16 days after the applications have been sent.
(See s. 75-5.)

60-15. Campground and Camping Resort Fees.

1. Each campground and camping resort permit shall be issued for a one-year period beginning on July 1 and ending on the following June 30.

2. The annual fees for campgrounds and camping resorts shall be:

a. 1-25 sites: \$75.

b. 26-50 sites: \$100.

c. 51-100 sites: \$120.

d. Over 100 sites: \$205.

3. In addition, the applicant shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee in the amount of 20% of the fees under sub. 2.
(See s. 64-01.)

60-16. Closing Out Sale License. 1. FEE. The fee for each license shall be the total of 2 charges:

a. The base charge shall be computed in accordance with the following schedule:

a-1. For a period not exceeding 15 days: \$42.

a-2. For a period not exceeding 30 days: \$80.

a-3. For a period not exceeding 60 days: \$122.

b. An additional charge shall be paid based upon the value of the inventory, computed at the rate of \$2 per \$1,000 of the cost price shown in the inventory filed in accordance with s. 88-1-3.

2. TAX DEPOSIT. An applicant shall pay a deposit in an amount that is sufficient to pay all personal property taxes that will be levied or assessed during the sale. Such deposit shall be used to pay personal property taxes.

3. EXTENSION OF TIME. A supplemental fee is required in addition to the regular license fee if an extension of time is granted pursuant to s. 88-1-4. The supplemental fee shall be \$38 per day. (See s. 88-1.)

60-17. Dry Cleaning Establishment Permit (Coin-operated). 1. Each dry cleaning establishment (coin-operated) permit shall be issued for a one-year period beginning on February 1 and ending on January 31.

2. The fee for each permit shall be \$180.

3. Each permit shall be renewed annually upon the payment of the required fee before February 1 of the following year. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application in the amount of \$25. (See s. 76-20.)

60-19. Dumping Permits. 1. a. The fee for each dump site permit under s. 80-45 shall be \$145.

b. Each permit shall run for a period of one year from the date of issuance and shall be subject to renewal.

2. The fee for dumping soil by the water department at the sanitation division's dump sites shall be \$10 per cubic yard.

3. a. The fee for a private operator to dump snow at any of the city's snow dump sites shall be \$145.

b. Each permit issued under par. a. shall run for a period of one year from the date of issuance. (See s. 80-45.)

60-20. Filling Station License. 1. Each filling station license shall be issued for a one-year period, beginning February 1 and expiring the following January 31.

2. The fee for each license shall be \$200.

3. There shall be an additional \$50 fee for the filing of a late renewal application. (See s. 84-45.)

60-21. Food Dealer's License. 1. Each individual food operation, site, location or stand where food is prepared, processed, served, stored or sold shall be issued a food dealer's license and be assessed fees in accordance with this section.

2. The amount of an annual food dealer's license fee shall be the following:

a. Prepack restaurants: For each license year: \$220.

b. All other restaurants:

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3. The food license fee set under sub. 2-b, c or d for a new operator that starts business after March 31 shall be based on the gross food sales for the time operated during that period.

4. If multiple independent restaurant locations are operated at the same address and by the same person, a separate fee shall be charged for each additional location. An additional restaurant location shall be considered independent if it is physically separated from any other food preparation areas. The annual fee for each additional location shall be \$56.

5. The yearly fee for a meal service establishment shall be \$22.

6. Each license shall be issued for the license period beginning on July 1 and ending the following June 30.

7. License renewals shall be filed by July 1. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application in the amount of \$44. If renewal applications are not sent out by June 15, the late penalty shall be assessed 16 days after the applications are sent.

8. The fee for a duplicate license is \$9.

9. In addition, the applicant shall pay any state of Wisconsin administrative fees, the amount of which is on file with the Wisconsin department of health and family services or department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection.
(See s. 68-4.)

60-23. Temporary Food Dealer's License.

1. DEFINITION. "Temporary event" means a single event such as a fair, carnival, circus, public exhibition, anniversary sale or occasional sales promotion that is held for a limited duration at a fixed location.

2. LICENSES. With the exception of a licensed food establishment that extends its operation to the outside on a temporary basis, each individual temporary food operation, site, location or stand where food is prepared, processed, served or sold shall be issued a temporary food dealer's license and be assessed fees in accordance with this section.

3. FEES. a. Restaurants. a-1. The fee per temporary event for the 1st day of operation of each temporary restaurant and for a temporary restaurant that operates no more than one day is \$67.

a-2. The fee per temporary event for each additional day of operation for each temporary restaurant is \$35.

a-3. The applicant shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee, the amount of which is on file with the Wisconsin department of health and family services.

b. Retail. b-1. The fee per temporary event for temporary food operations that process food at the point of sale is \$67.

b-2. The fee per temporary event for temporary food operations that do not process food at the point of sale is \$44.

b-3. The applicant shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee, the amount of which is on file with the Wisconsin department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection.

c. Farmers' market. The fee for an annual temporary food dealer's license for vendors who offer for sale foods other than restaurant foods is \$72.

d. The following fees shall apply to a licensed food establishment that extends its operation to the outside on a temporary basis:

d-1. For an extension of a licensed premises that operates one day or less: \$50.

d-2. For an extension of a licensed premises that operates for more than one day: \$65.

4. APPLICATION DEADLINE. An applicant for any food-related license in this chapter for a temporary event shall make the application and pay the applicable fee specified in this chapter no later than 5 calendar days prior to the opening date of the temporary event.

5. LATE FEE. Any person who does not meet the application deadline in sub. 4 shall pay a late application fee of \$44 for each individual food operation, site, location or stand where food is prepared, served or sold at the temporary event.

6. DUPLICATE PERMIT. The fee for a duplicate permit is \$9.

7. STATE FEES. In addition, the applicant shall pay any state of Wisconsin administrative fees, the amount of which is on file with the Wisconsin department of health and family services or department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection.

(See s. 68-4.)

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60-25. Food Operations - Plan Examinations.

1. The fee for each portion of a food operations - plan examination for fire protection, plumbing or ventilation equipment shall be \$67.

2. The fee for each complete plan review shall be \$222.

3. Fees under this section are nonrefundable. (See s. 68-4.5.)

60-27. Food Operations-Preinspections. The nonrefundable fee for each preinspection of a food operation's license or permit, whether such license or permit is subsequently issued or not, shall be:

1. For change of operator only, with no change in the operation or equipment: \$50.

2. For new operations with no new construction or substantial alterations: \$50.

3. For new or altered food operations which involve new construction or substantial alterations: \$195. (See s. 68-4.)

60-29. Food Peddler Basic Permit. The fee for each food peddler basic permit shall be:

1. For each motorized vehicle: \$111.

2. For each pushed, peddled or pulled vehicle: \$94.

3. For each person carrying containers: \$78. (See s. 74-1.)

60-31. Food Peddler Permits. 1. The total fee for each food peddler permit shall be a combination of the food peddler - basic fee in s. 60-29 and the following additional fees, when applicable:

a. Restaurant: see s. 60-71.

b. Food processing - retail: see s. 60-39.

2. The surcharge for a food peddler permit to allow night operation by a food peddler shall be \$33.

3. Each food peddler permit shall be issued for the license period beginning on July 1 and ending the following June 30.

4. Permit renewals shall be filed July 1. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application in the amount of \$44. If renewal applications are not sent out by June 15, the late penalty will be assessed 16 days after the applications have been sent.

5. The fee for a duplicate permit or identifying device is \$9. (See s. 74-1.)

60-39. Food Processing - Retail. 1. The food processing - retail fee applies to food peddlers that process at the point of sale. (See ss. 60-23 and 60-31.)

2. The fee shall be:

3. In addition, the applicant shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee, the amount of which is on file with the Wisconsin department of health and family services or department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection. (See s. 68-4.)

60-43. Grooming Establishment, Animals.

1. Each animal grooming establishment permit shall be issued for the calendar year.

2. The fee for each permit shall be \$70.

3. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application on or after January 1 of the following year in the amount of \$30. (See s. 78-11.)

60-45. Health Certificate to Travel. The fee for the issuance of any health certificate to travel shall be \$1. (See s. 59-17.)

60-47. Horse Stable Permit. 1. Each horse stable permit shall be issued for the calendar year ending December 31.

2. The fee for each permit shall be \$70.

3. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application on or after January 1 of the following year in the amount of \$30. (See s. 78-7.)

60-48. Ice Cream Peddler License. 1. The fee for each ice cream peddler license shall be \$61.

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2. Each license shall be issued for the license period beginning July 1 and ending on June 30.

3. The fee for a duplicate license is \$9. (See s. 74-2.)

60-49. Inoculation Fee. The fee for the provision for an inoculation for overseas travel shall be \$41.

60-51. Kennel Permit. 1. Each kennel permit shall be issued for the calendar year.

2. The fee for each license shall be \$70.

3. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application on or after January 1 of the following year in the amount of \$30. (See s. 78-7.)

60-52. Laboratory Services. 1. A fee shall be charged for laboratory services provided by the health department, with the exception of those tests listed in sub. 2, based on the most current charges specified by the state laboratory of hygiene. Lead screening and testing fees shall be based on the most current Title 19 Medicaid reimbursement rates as set by the state of Wisconsin for health maintenance organizations. New tests added in the future shall be regulated by the guidelines for laboratory fees in the state laboratory of hygiene reference manual or by rates set by the state for Title 19 Medicaid reimbursement of health maintenance organizations.

2. There shall be no fee charged for the following tests and any other test determined by the commissioner of health as appropriate based on public health needs or considerations:

- a. Specimens for pertussis.
- b. Reference cultures.

3. The following tests shall be charged a handling fee determined by the health department:

- a. Specimens for legionella.
- b. Specimens for mycobacteria.

60-53. Laundry, Self-service Registration Certificate. 1. Each self-service laundry registration certificate shall be issued for each specific location for a one-year period beginning on February 1 and ending on the following January 31.

2. The fee for each certificate shall be \$60.

3. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application on or after February 1 of the following year in the amount of \$30. (See s. 75-1.)

60-54. Lead Reduction Permit. The fee for each lead reduction permit shall be \$57 per dwelling, dwelling unit, supplemental location or premises. (See s. 66-22.)

60-57. Masonry Building Cleaning, Sandblasting Permit. 1. The fee for each permit for each calendar day or partial calendar day for masonry building cleaning shall be \$50.

2. No fee shall be charged for a permit issued for purposes of removing graffiti. (See s. 80-29.)

60-58. Massage Establishment License.

1. Each massage establishment license shall be issued for a one-year period beginning on March 1 and ending on the following February 28.

2. The fee for each license shall be \$235.

3. If an applicant is not granted a license, a portion of the application fee shall be returned to the applicant in the amount of \$79.

4. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application on or after March 1 of the following year in the amount of \$50. (See s. 75-21.)

60-65. Mobile Home Park Fees. 1. Each mobile home park permit shall be issued for a one-year period beginning on July 1 and ending on the following June 30.

2. The annual fee for mobile home parks shall be:

- a. 1-25 sites: \$ 77.
- b. 26-50: \$149.
- c. 51-100: \$181.
- d. Over 100 sites: \$204.

3. In addition, the applicant shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee in the amount of 20% of the fees under sub. 2. (See s. 64-01.)

60-66. Noise Variance Permit. The fee for application for a noise variance permit shall be \$40.

(See s. 80-66.)

60-67. Pesticide Applicator Certificate, Commercial. 1. Each commercial pest control operator's certificate shall be issued for a one-year period, commencing on February 1 and expiring on the following January 31.

2. The fee for each certificate shall be \$55.

3. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application on or after February 1 of the following year in the amount of \$27.

(See s. 77-5.)

60-69. Pet Shop License. 1. Each pet shop license shall be issued for the calendar year.

2. The fee for each license shall be \$70.

3. There shall be an additional late fee for the filing of a late renewal application on or after January 1 of the following year in the amount of \$30.

(See s. 78-9.)

60-70. Inspection Fees for Health Code Violations. 1. PREVIOUSLY DOCUMENTED.

a. If as a result of the routine inspection a violation which had been documented at the time of the previous routine inspection is found, the fee for the routine inspection shall be \$87.

b. The fee for the first reinspection under this subsection relating to the same order to correct the violation shall be \$173. The fee for each subsequent reinspection shall be the fee for the previous reinspection plus an additional \$87.

c. Fees for any inspection under this subsection shall be assessed at the time of the inspection only if the order to correct the violation has not been complied with.

2. NOT PREVIOUSLY DOCUMENTED.

a. If as a result of the routine inspection a violation which had not been documented at the time of the previous routine inspection is found, the fee for the first reinspection relating to the order to correct the violation is \$87.

b. The fee for the second reinspection under this subsection relating to the same order to correct the violation shall be \$173. The fee for each subsequent reinspection shall be the fee for the previous reinspection plus an additional \$87.

c. Fees for any reinspection under this subsection shall be assessed at the time of the reinspection only if the order to correct the violation has not been complied with.

60-71. Mobile Restaurants/Peddlers. 1. The following fees apply to peddlers who serve meals:

a. For prepackaged food - \$67.

b. For food preparation - \$128.

2. In addition, the applicant shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee, the amount of which is on file with the Wisconsin department of health and family services or department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection.

(See ss. 60-21 and 68-4.)

60-72. Site Evaluation - Food Operation. The fee for each site evaluation of a food operation site shall be as follows:

1. For a food operation that does not engage in food processing, the fee shall be \$89.

2. For a food operation that engages in food processing, the fee shall be \$172.

(See s. 68-4.5.)

60-81. Swimming and Other Water Use Facility Operating Licenses. 1. Each swimming or other water use facility operating license shall be issued for the license year beginning July 1 and ending the following June 30.

2. The fee for each swimming or other water use facility operating license shall be \$205.

3. In addition to the fees under sub. 2, an applicant shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee, the amount of which is on file with the department.

4. For the premises that have more than one of the facilities specified in sub. 2 which are inspected at the same time, \$5 per fee shall be deducted for each facility over one.

5. License renewals must be filed by July 1. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application in the amount of \$27. If renewal applications are not sent out by June 15, the late penalty will be assessed 16 days after the applications have been sent.

7. The fee to transfer a license shall be \$35.

(See s. 75-20.2.)

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60-83. Swimming and Other Water Use Facilities: Plan Examinations and Preinspections.

1. The fee for each plan examination and preinspection for swimming and other water use facilities shall be:

- a. Private temporary facility plan examination: \$40.
- b. Nonmobile temporary facility plan examination made prior to construction: \$40.
- c. Private nonmobile facility plan examination paid after construction has begun: \$55.
- d. Complete facility review and preinspections of a public pool, excluding wading pools: \$150.
- e. Partial facility review and preinspections of a public pool, excluding wading pools: \$60.
- f. Complete review and preinspections of a public wading pool: \$100.
- g. Partial review of a public wading pool: \$60.
- h. Public facility review or preinspection paid after construction has begun: 1.5 times the fee amounts in pars. d to g.

2. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late application in the amount of \$27.

3. Fees listed in this section shall not be refundable.

(See s. 75-20.1.)

60-83.5. Tattooing and Body-Piercing Establishments. 1. **TATTOO ESTABLISHMENT LICENSE.** The fee for a tattoo establishment license shall be \$144. The fee for a temporary tattoo establishment license shall be \$144.

2. **BODY-PIERCING ESTABLISHMENT LICENSE.** The fee for a body-piercing establishment license shall be \$144. The fee for a temporary body-piercing establishment license shall be \$144.

3. **COMBINED TATTOO/BODY-PIERCING LICENSE.** The fee for a combined tattoo/body-piercing establishment license shall be \$211. The fee for a temporary combined tattoo/body-piercing establishment license shall be \$144.

4. **PREINSPECTION FEE.** For inspection of a new tattooing or body-piercing establishment, a preinspection fee of \$100 shall be charged.

5. **STATE FEE.** In addition to the license fees specified in this section, an applicant for a tattoo or body-piercing establishment license shall pay the state of Wisconsin administrative fee for such license, the amount of which is on file with the Wisconsin department of health and family services.

6. **DUPLICATE LICENSE.** The fee for a duplicate copy of any of the licenses listed in this section shall be \$9.

7. **LATE FEE.** There shall be an additional fee of \$44 for the late filing of a renewal application for any of the licenses listed in this section.

(See s. 75-51.)

60-84. Waste Tire Transporters and Generators.

1. Each waste tire generator or transporter license shall be issued for a one-year period beginning October 1 and expiring the following September 30.

2. The following fees apply to waste tire transporter and generator licenses:

a. For a waste tire transporter license: \$120 for the first vehicle and \$30 for each additional vehicle.

b. For each waste tire generator license: \$150.

c. No fee shall be charged to city departments or the vehicles of those departments.

3. There shall be an additional fee for the filing of a late renewal application on or after October 1 of the following year in the amount of \$50.

(See s. 84-48.)

60-87. Vital Records. Fees charged for the search, filing and issuing of certified copies of births and deaths and for making authorized corrections, alterations or additions to those records shall be those prescribed in s. 69.22, Wis. Stats.

60-91. Weighing and Measuring Device Licenses. Each of the following weighing and measuring device licenses shall be issued for the calendar year. Each license may be renewed annually upon payment of the required fee before January 1 of the following year.

1. **LINEAR METERS.**
 - a. The fee for each linear meter license shall be \$24.
 - b. The fee for the filing of a late renewal application shall be \$44.
 - c. The fee for a duplicate linear meter license is \$9.
2. **RETAIL PETROLEUM METERS.**
 - a. The fee for each retail petroleum meter license shall be \$44.
 - b. The fee for the filing of a late renewal application shall be \$44.
 - c. The fee for a duplicate retail petroleum meter license is \$9.
3. **SCALES.** a. The following schedule of fees shall apply to scale licenses:

- b. The fee for the filing of a late renewal application is \$44.
 - c. The fee for a duplicate scale license is \$9.
4. **TAXIMETERS.**
 - a. The fee for each taximeter license shall be \$50.
 - b. The fee for a filing of a late renewal application shall be \$44.
 - c. The fee for a duplicate taximeter license is \$9.
5. **TIMING DEVICES.**
 - a. The fee for each timing device license shall be \$11.
 - b. The fee for the filing of a late renewal application shall be \$44.
 - c. The fee for a duplicate timing device license is \$9.
6. **VEHICLE TANK AND BULK PLANT METERS.**
 - a. The fee for each vehicle tank and bulk plant meter license shall be \$100.
 - b. The fee for a filing of a late renewal application shall be \$44.
 - c. The fee for a duplicate vehicle tank or bulk plant meter license is \$9.

7. **VEHICLE SCALES.** Each license shall be issued for the calendar year.
 - a. **Public Vehicle Scales.** The fee for each public vehicle scale shall be \$189.
 - b. **"Type I" Nonpublic Vehicle Scales.** The fee for each "type 1" nonpublic vehicle scale shall be \$139.
 - c. **"Type II" Nonpublic Vehicle Scales.** The fee for each "type II" nonpublic vehicle scale shall be \$139.
 - d. **Late Fee.** There shall be an additional fee of \$44 for the filing of a late renewal application after January 1 of each year.
 - e. **Duplicates.** The fee for a duplicate license specified in this subsection shall be \$9. (See s. 82-14.)
